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The My Melbourne Road survey was a collaborative effort that invited everyone who uses our transport network - motorists, cyclists, pedestrians and public transport users – to highlight unsafe roads and intersections.


Inside you'll find some of the key findings taken from 5,000 responses.

Intersection safety, driver behaviour, and pedestrian and cyclist safety were the top three concerns that you have raised with us. We will be taking these concerns to governments and advocating for improvements to the roads you have identified.

The results remind us that safety is not just about safer speeds and safer roads, but driver behaviour. We are seeing a direct link between drivers taking increased risks when there are high levels of traffic congestion.

I'd like to thank everyone who responded to the survey. Your support is a testament to the care we have for one another and our desire to prevent lives being lost on our roads.

# Foreword by Phil Turnbull

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Many of the roads and intersections identified in the survey highlight the need for improved cycling and pedestrian infrastructure. The results also remind us that policymakers need to include pedestrians and cyclists in the development of road safety initiatives.

From here, RACV will engage with governments to address the findings. Thankfully, many of the proposed solutions that you have put forward are not high cost. Upgrades like zebra crossings, improved lighting and traffic lights are all actionable if we have the will.

RACV's *My Melbourne Road* is how we listen to Victorians about their safety concerns regarding Melbourne's transport network, so that we can act on behalf of the community to help improve safety on our roads.

It follows RACV's *My Country Road* survey which saw 4,000 respondents identify safety concerns on 31 regional roads across Victoria.

We engaged with government advocating for change and as a result, 16 regional roads have already been upgraded or commited to works.

In March 2023, *My Melbourne Road* invited all motorists, cyclists, pedestrians and public transport users via an interactive online map, to have their say about safety concerns on any road or intersection across 31 local council areas.

By highlighting a street, intersection or stretch of road, participants could voice their concerns about unsafe speed limits, poor road conditions, driver or cycling behaviour or any other safety issue.

# What you told us

Below you'll find some of the key findings taken from 5,000 responses.

### Road and intersection safety

Overly complex intersections were the top safety issue that you identified. One-third of participants called for lower speeds on the roads regularly used. Many of the solutions identified included low-cost solutions such as zebra crossings and better-positioned traffic lights.

• *Moonee Valley's Mount Alexander Road* – where it meets with Keilor Road – received the most responses for safety concerns in both the road and intersection categories. You told us that Mount Alexander Road had several confusing roundabouts, was dangerous for pedestrians attempting to cross the road and had a lack of protected cycling infrastructure.

• Dandenong Road running through Windsor, Prahran and Caulfield was flagged as the second most dangerous road, followed in third place by Sydney Road in Brunswick and Coburg.

### Pedestrian and cycling safety

The most vulnerable road users – cyclists and pedestrians – were the most highly represented in the feedback. Many of the roads and intersections with the most number of responses had pedestrian or cyclist-related safety issues as their primary concern.

Three of the roads with the most number of responses are Strategic Cycling Corridors. The roads highlighted by cyclists were St Kilda Road in Melbourne and Barkly and Hopkins Streets in Footscray. The intersections respondents believed needed improved pedestrian and cycling infrastructure were Bay Street and Liardet Road in Port Melbourne, Flemington Road and Royal Parade in North Melbourne and Williamstown Road and Beacon Road in Port Melbourne.

### Driver behaviour

The behaviour of drivers – including speeding and dangerous driving – was a key concern, with one-third of all respondents indicating that a lower speed limit on their nominated road would improve safety.

# Mount Alexander Road / Keilor Road Essendon

"Nightmare intersection. Even locals struggle with all the ins and outs let alone drivers unfamiliar with the area."



## Princes Freeway / Geelong Road Exit Werribee

"Cars exiting the freeway westbound have to queue up for kilometres in the emergency lane to exit here. Very unsafe with trucks hurtling past at 100km per hour."



## Wellington Road / Dorning Road Narre Warren East

"Corner of Wellington Road and Dorning Road is unsafe due to the low visibility bend and a 100km/h speed limit and no turning lane into the childcare centre."















# Bay Street / Liardet Road Port Melbourne

"Roundabout at Twickenham and Loyola. Near misses every time I use the roundabout."

"One right turning lane (towards the Tulla) here is simply not sufficient. It causes lots of banked up traffic and congestion, leading to frustration and people changing lanes etc."

"There is an accident or a near miss on this corner every single week without failure. Why are we waiting for a fatality before any action is taken. Lights are needed ASAP and a red light camera at that."

"This roundabout regularly confuses motorists, which is amplified by the fact it also has a tram line through it and it used by people unfamiliar with the area (as it is right by Royal Melbourne Hospital)."

# Lorimer Street / Wurundjeri Way Docklands

"Cars in lane 2 travelling on Montague Street towards the city are always moving into lane 1 due to poor lane markings. I travel this intersection daily and I see cars doing this daily."

"This intersection is the most hated intersection in Port Melbourne. Although the data only shows collisions reported, near misses happen every day for pedestrians, cyclists and cars. It really needs a better


# Williamstown Road / Beacon Road Port Melbourne
